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Year 7 Biology - Cell Models



School success starts with attendance

The Importance of School Attendance: Striving for 95%

At Nidderdale High School, we believe that regular school attendance is the foundation of academic success. Currently, our school's attendance rate is 91.3%, but we know that we can do better. That's why we're setting a goal of reaching 95% attendance, and we need your help to get there.

Why 95%?

Research shows that students with attendance above 95% are significantly more likely to achieve better grades and develop the resilience and responsibility needed to thrive in the future. Missing just one or two days every few weeks may not seem like much, but it adds up over time. At 91.3%, students are missing nearly three weeks of school a year. That's three weeks of lost learning, missed opportunities, and disrupted progress.

The Impact of Missing School

- Falling Behind: Even small gaps in attendance can leave students struggling to catch up.
- **Social Effects**: Consistent attendance helps students build positive friendships and a sense of belonging. When students miss school, they can feel out of the loop and disconnected from their peers.
- **Long-Term Outcomes**: Students who regularly attend school are more likely to develop the work habits that lead to future success, whether in further education, apprenticeships, or the workforce.

How You Can Help

Parents and carers play a crucial role in supporting good attendance. Here's how you can help us reach our 95% goal:

- **Establish a Routine**: Set clear expectations for bedtime and morning routines to ensure your child is ready and on time for school each day.
- **Keep in Touch**: If your child is unwell or there's a reason they can't attend, please inform us as soon as possible. We're here to support you.
- Be Engaged: Encourage your child to talk about their school day and stay positive about their education.
