#### Dear Parent / Carer

We have now been working on Arbor for two weeks for all homework and behaviour. Thank you for your patience and support as we have moved all families to new log ins and some new ways of working and communicating. Our focus on our school value of ambition has been well reflected on Arbor, being the top awarded positive for all of our values. In the first week of this half term we awarded 235 positive points for ambition and 178 for resilience.

Each Area of Learning has been reflecting on how each of our school values are promoted and demonstrated across all subjects. From the empathy shown by designers, to the ambition generated by reading challenging texts and the responsibility needed for practical science it has been really interesting and inspiring to see just how many different ways our core values are promoted through school. 

This charity helped over 32000 people in 2023 and is gaining more support each year.
