Dear Parent / Carer

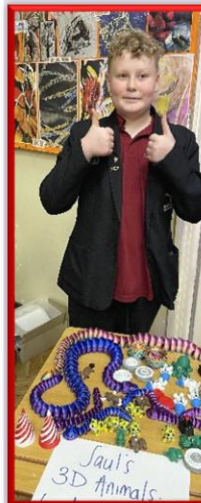

Flourish Curriculum at Nidderdale High School

Students in Key Stage 3 have been enthusiastically taking part in a wide range of Flourish activities as part of their personal development curriculum. Flourish is a dedicated programme designed to support students' wellbeing, confidence and personal growth, providing them with time and space to enjoy learning beyond the classroom in a supportive environment.

As part of the curriculum, every student completes one core activity, one physical activity and one creative activity each year, ensuring a broad and balanced experience. These activities are carefully designed to promote teamwork, resilience, creativity and positive mental health.

Across the programme, we have seen students develop valuable life skills. In cooking sessions, students have strengthened their problem-solving and independence skills, while chemistry experiments have encouraged collaboration, communication and curiosity. Creative activities, including crafts with Ms Carpenter, have allowed students to express themselves artistically, while art sessions have provided opportunities for students to reflect on and open up about their wellbeing through painting and creative expression.

Physical activities have also played a key role in Flourish. Through team games and our popular NiddVenture sessions, students have enjoyed being active outdoors, taking part in local walks, orienteering and bushcraft. These experiences help students understand the benefits of being outdoors, develop teamwork and build resilience while engaging with nature.

Overall, the Flourish curriculum continues to be a positive and enriching experience for our students, supporting their wellbeing while helping them develop important skills that will benefit them both in and out of school.

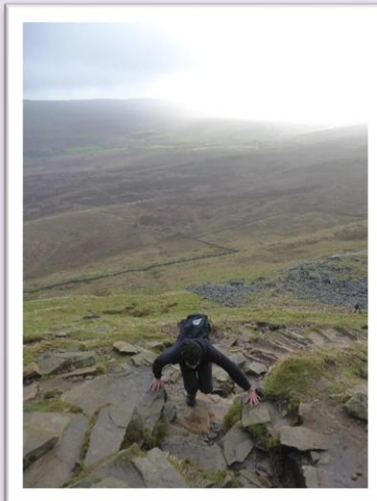

Thank you all for some great days out exploring our beautiful Yorkshire Alps this term.



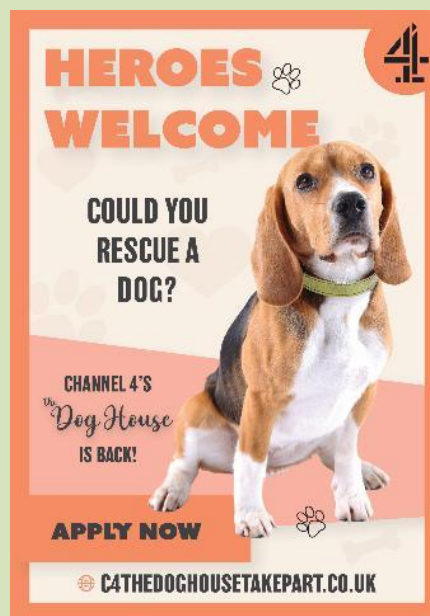
Rugby Success
